SBA Position Descriptions:

SBA Legislative Representative:

An SBA Legislative Representative is governed mainly by Article IV of the SBA Bylaws. The 2L and 3L SBA Legislative Representatives must be selected by eight (8) at large seats for their class. All SBA Representatives are expected to attend the regular SBA Meetings (usually monthly but can be more as called for by the Vice President.) If a representative is unable to attend a meeting, they are expected to email the SBA secretary to let them know and they are able to be absent for up to two (2) meetings a semester. Additionally, SBA representatives are expected to assist with SBA hosted event and contribute to the committees of which they are assigned. They are required to do five (5) service hours per semester. This is simply an incentive to get involved with what SBA is doing in the law school community! While you are serving as an SBA Legislative Representative you will have the opportunity to serve on these committees to make a difference in your classmates' lives!
